

# CALIFORNIA CONFORMITY UPDATE: IRS EXTENDS FILING DEADLINE FOR CALIFORNIA STORM VICTIMS: TAX RELIEF

The Govenor's office announced on January 13, 2023, that California will conform to the filing extensions granted by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for California storm victims.

This means that filing and payment deadlines for affected individuals and businesses in California are extended to May 15, 2023.

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On January 10, the IRS announced tax relief for California storm victims in disaster areas designated by the <u>Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)</u>. This tax relief applies to individuals who live in and businesses whose principal place of business is located in disaster areas. The announcement *postpones tax filings and payment deadlines* that are <u>due from January 8, 2023, through April 30, 2023</u>, including *individual and business income tax returns, payroll and excise returns,* and payments due during that period. The due date for returns and payments is extended to May 15th.

Delaying payment of taxes due until May 15th is the most beneficial aspect of the disaster relief and you are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity. However, recalling the chaos of the extended due dates during the pandemic, **taxpayers are urged to not delay the process of getting returns prepared**. Even if you want to file and pay at a later time, start the process as early as possible.
